DR. KLOPSCH LAID AT REST.

Mr. Taft Sends Floral Wreath with Letter of Condolence to Widow.

The funeral of Dr. Louis Klopsch, editor of The Christian Herald, who died Sunday, was held at the Metropolitan Temple yesterday. The Rev. John Wesley Hill, the Rev. Wallace MacMullen, the Rev. F. C. Ingleshart, the Rev. John G. Hammond, and the Rev. John M. Buckley participated in the services. A chorus of 500 children from the Mount Lawn Summer Home, at Nyack, N. Y., sang Dr. Klopsch's favorite hymns. The honorary pallbearers were Rear Admiral Charles D. Sigsbee, J. J. Little, John C. Earl, G. H. Sandison, J. A. Belford, Otto Koenig, R. R. Bromfield, William B. Howland, Orison Swett Marden, R. D. Carter, Arthur J. Little, Charles Francis, and S. A. Everitt. Interment was made at Sleepy Hollow Cemetery, at Tarrytown, N. Y.

Among the floral offerings was a three-foot wreath of white hyacinths and am-lax from President and Mrs. Taft. Mr. Taft, on Dec. 7 last, accompanied Dr. Klopsch to the Bowery Mission, which he had founded, and addressed the beneficiaries. The President also sent the following letter:

My Dear Mrs. Klopsch: I was greatly shocked to note in the papers of yesterday that your good husband passed away under the effect of an operation. I had not known him long, but I have known him long enough to know of the good that he has done, the charity that he has encouraged, and the gratitude that he is entitled to from the poor and the oppressed. I sincerely hope that the memory of all these things will sustain you in your grief.

Mr. Klopsch's will was filed yesterday. It was executed on March 1, and leaves all the estate of the late editor of the Christian Herald to his wife, Mary M. Klopsch, and makes her sole executrix without bonds. The amount of the estate did not appear.
